9:00 -Charlie Dyer - The Conclusion to the Conflict (How will it all end. . . and what do we need to do now?)





Operation Christmas Child

Through the Follow Your Box program of OCC, our boxes shipped to...
331 boxes were sent in the first week of December to the Philippines and Madagascar.
4 boxes were "built" online through OCC were sent in mid- November to "Hard to Reach Areas", where Christians are a minority and often persecuted. These countries cannot be publicly named. Thank you for giving so others can hear the Gospel and learn of Jesus' love for them.

Grand Community Baptist's Missions Giving

As a church following Jesus, we have an emphasis on missions as Jesus' life was and is about the mission of finding people that were lost, showing them God's love and bringing people into the fold. Jesus said in Acts 1:8 "but you receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you shall by My witnesses both in Jerusalem and in all Judea, and Samaria, and as far as the remotest part of the earth" He also gave the Great Commission in Matthew 28: 19-20 which includes "Go, therefore, and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and the Son, and the Holy Spirit, teaching them...."

As part of the Southern Baptist Convention our church has a great opportunity to fund missions in various ways to reach the masses for Jesus.

As a church, we give out of the general fund offering received each month, 10% to the Cooperative Program (CP). 60 % of the funds given to CP stays in AZ to fund mission needs in our state through our AZ Mission Network (formerly the AZ SBC Convention). Then, 40% is given to the SBC convention, which when combined with the giving of the other state conventions, helps to fund the SBC entities including: administrative cost (a small percentage), the 6 seminaries of the SBC are given a small portion, the North American Mission Board and International Mission Boards get a large percentage that makes up to 40-50% both the mission boards annual budgets, and the Ethics and Religious Liberty Commission. This giving would be to the Samaria and even the remotest ends of the earth of which Jesus spoke.

Our church also gives 3% of our general offerings to the Estrella Baptist Association to support the missions in our association, generally located in West Valley, our Jerusalem and Judea Jesus mentioned.

At Easter time we do collect a special offering, The Annie Armstrong Offering, for the North American Missionaries (NAMB). This offering provides roughly half of the annual funding that NAMB receives each year. The Cooperative Program funds cannot fully fund the mission need here in the US and Canada. This offering helps reach the Judea and Samaria parts of our country that Acts 1:8 speaks of.

At Christmas time we collect the Lottie Moon Christmas Offering, this too is roughly half of the funding the International Mission Board receives to reach people in the remotest part of the earth.

We have an Arizona Mission Offering in September that assists our Arizona Mission Network in assisting the mission churches/church plants/education events/pastors in crisis/revitalizing church-church ministry/ Zona youth camp and more. This is our Jerusalem and Judea in AZ.

There may be other offerings and projects to donate to during the year such as the baby bottle loose change for pregnancy care centers, missionaries that visit may receive a love offering from us, and other special offerings or projects in the year may come up which people may choose to support. These are voluntary as all offerings are and fit all the categories from Jerusalem to the remotest parts of the earth depending on the people they will reach.

Why the various offerings? —the need is great to reach the multitudes of lost people in our community, county, state, country and world. It is mandated by Jesus that we reach the world. While we may not be able to go on mission trips, we can pray for, learn about and give to missions.

Jesus asks for our tithe to the church in obedience to Him, the special offerings are above and beyond this and voluntary. The resolute obedience of our church to tithe back to the LORD and to give special offerings, brings blessings from the LORD to our church! A giving and mission-oriented church will have the favor of the LORD as we chase after His own heart.

The Mission Committee

There have been questions about the Mission Committee (MC), its purpose and role and how it is different than the general missions giving. Let's look at what the committee is and does.

The Mission Committee (MC) has appointed members to it for 3-year terms. The Committee has nothing to do with the handling of general funds or the special offerings mentioned in the GCBC mission article, other than setting the special offering goals. The MC is tasked with spending the funds people donate to generic (undesignated) missions. The Committee has a resolution to take seriously the funding of requests that honor God, help to reach people with the Gospel message, and discipleship people in the LORD.

The MC funds ministries monthly for a year at a time, special short-term needs, and one-time events.

- An example, of a monthly ministry funded is to a junior college campus AZ missionary who has helped lead six young adults to the LORD this year at Pima Community College.
- A one-time event is the Christmas in the Village program that a missionary, Eric Gibbs, of Live Love Ministries runs. At Christmas, the ministry raises funds to give the impoverished Tohono O'odham children in up to 12 tribal villages Christmas presents by allowing their parents to pick free gifts for their children. The Gospel is presented at each of the villages Christmas parties where the kids receive their gifts. The Christmas party and gifts helps Eric develop and maintain relationships that will help lead the people to Jesus.
- A one-time project the committee gave to this Fall was funds to help hand dig 2 wells in West Africa, so the refugees could have a source of water near them. The missionaries tell the people the LORD through His people provided the wells and introduce them to the Living Water.

If you choose to give to the undesignated missions for the Mission Committee to distribute the funds, please do so in addition to your tithe.

Know the MC is using the money given each month, giving more than is received in general. The Committee is mindful that God wants the funds spent that reach people for Him through accountable ministries. The MC also understands there is a need for some cushion of funds to allow fulfillment of the promised funding in low-income months and for special needs and events of the ministries. The Mission Committee is looking forward to what the LORD will do through the generosity of our people at Grand Community Baptist. Keep an eye out on the board in the foyer to see ministry updates!

Don't be a Neil... 39 years ago, at my church was a man named Neil. Nei I at 82 years old, was a deacon, a Sunday morning Bible study teacher, and a leader in the church. Neil would smile and greet people, but most experienced that he liked to be in control, that he was often hard to work with, if he didn't like a program in the church he would persuade people against it. People tip-toed around Neil to get things accomplished, and yet he often got his way. Everyone including the Pastor found he was hard to work with.

One Sunday morning during the invitation, Neil came forward. He prayed with the Pastor, then Neil addressed the congregation. Neil gave a shocking testimony--- God got a hold of Neil, through his Bible study, prayer and largely the Holy Spirit. God made it clear to Neil that he did not belong to God; he was not a Christian. He recounted that at 9 years old his parents made him go forward to receive Christ, but it was not his choice or decision, neither was his baptism. He was an imposter, just grew up in the church and put on the Christian face and title, said the right words, acted like a Christian as much as he could. The problem was he was not acting with love or through the Holy Spirit. He had become problematic to the church, harsh, legalistic, a grumbler, made everyone know what he did not like and more. Neil stood there, told everyone, at 82 years after decades in the church, he had asked Jesus into his heart during that past week. He was baptized soon after by his choice in obedience to Jesus.

Neil was changed by his Jesus. He had a "softer" attitude, no longer being a roadblock, had a larger genuine smile, was more cooperative, in short, he became someone who was starting to really show Christ's love.

What Neil said then and what he would tell you today: Growing up in church, being born into a "Christian" family, going through the motions of praying to receive Jesus and even being baptized does not make you a Christian if you truly did not seek and submit to Jesus. All it makes you is an imposter, still lost. One who is still hell bound at death.

To truly put on Christ and be counted as His, you must accept Him as Savior and submit to Him as LORD. Neil experienced and understood this when he made his resolute life changing decision at 82. To be a Christian is to have a whole-life commitment. As a Pastor friend has said—when one accepts Jesus, He does not leave the person the same. There is a Spirit led change. If there is no change, then the person is likely not really saved.

Make sure you are not a Neil, at least in his first 82 years of life, but... be the Neil once he started his eternal life with Jesus at 82 years old. Neil would tell you, Heaven is worth it, even if it took all he had to come forward and proclaim he had been lost and faking Christianity. The cost of exposure that day did not compare to the cost of not belonging to Jesus. Make sure you have made the decision to follow Jesus, for you don't want to miss Heaven with Him! If you have not decided on your own accord, there is no time like the present to seek Him out, answer His call, accept Him as your Savior and LORD, and commit your life to Him! Don't delay a true and heartfelt response, for we are not promised even to finish today before God calls us to meet with Him. You want to hear, "Well done good and faithful servant", not "Depart from Me for I never knew you". The choice is yours. This is a true story that I have shared it many times over the years, including in the women's Bible study here at Grand Community. I have seen Neil's story make an impact in others for resolute life change. **Stephanie Short**
