Pastor's Note

In the birding world, these are great days. Spring is full of wonderful surprises. Sometimes that means the return of a bird that migrated away last fall, other times it's the passing through of a bird that is rarely seen here, or it might be the discovery of a nest with the hatchlings of some common species.

On a recent bird walk, the group noticed a hummingbird nest. On that particular day the hummingbird was frenetically dashing to and away from the nest. There is a nearby owls' nest that is rather famous. I was happy to learn of a hummingbirds' nest nearby that was also being used this year. As I tend to walk past the owls' nest regularly, I added a stop at the hummingbirds' home.

About a week later I found momma hummingbird feeding babies. All I could see of the babies were upward pointed mouths, but I could clearly see momma standing high on the rim and pointing her beak straight down into those open mouths. I had never seen anything like this before, or since. It's even possible that the babies are already fledged.

New life is always exciting, owlets and ... hummerlets? Whatever a baby hummingbird is called.

But despite how much I love nature, and birds, for new life to be really exciting it would be new life in the Kingdom. Seeing people saved and baptized. 



Mission Committee News

What gently used items can mean to a person... clothing, a blanket to sleep on and more. In Warren's case, he was homeless and went to Love Baptist Church's Wednesday night free meal and the opportunity to get some needed items one week a few months ago. He met and spoke with Pastor Adam Henry during the meal. Warren, a Christian, by background realized how far he had slipped away from God after meeting the people of Love who attended to his physical and spiritual needs. He went to detox inpatient setting that weekend, then to the VA Medical Center Substance Use Disorder program. He is open to the people of Love Baptist that helped him and asked the Pastor to visit him while at his VA program.

Through your generous undesignated offering to missions, the Mission Committee is able to give to Love Baptist Church for special needs- such as their food pantry funds, Thanksgiving food baskets for food insecure families and children's Christmas event of a party which allows for the sharing the story of Jesus and passing out of Christmas gifts for the children to whom they minister.

As a church, we give each year to their back-to-school needs for the children at Love Baptist and gifts through the Angel Christmas Tree emphasis. Then, of course the First Sunday Share, where we can give gently used items on the first Sunday of the month to help Love Baptist minister to their own members/attendees and to people like Warren. Through these various avenues of giving, our church helps another local church impact their community and potentially to lead others to new life in Christ.

Be Wary of Scammers!

This past week I had two people tell me that they received requests from some scammer claiming to be me. One of the scammers pretending to be me, had requested that the person purchase gift cards and promised reimbursement from the church. Thankfully that person called me to verify before spending any money. Scammers might also pretend to be a friend, or fellow church member.

If you ever receive a financial request, verify it. If it's in relation to this church, verify it by contacting the church. If we are raising money for a mission cause, we will make that clear in the services, events and/or publications, rather than unexpected text messages or emails.

If a friend contacts you this way, protect yourself, by looking up the contact of the person in the directory or some known source, and asking if it was really them. I suspect, it will not really be the person but a scammer pretending to be them. They found you were friends, neighbors or members on facebook.

As an extra hint, if they ask for gift cards, crypto currency, or similar non traceable funds, they are scamming. If they ask for funds to be mailed or transferred instead of brought to church, they are scamming.

Let's stay safe out there. And as one final request, if you are approached or have been approached by these scams, please let me know so that I can keep track of how to educate others about what to watch for.
