Pastor's Note



One of the more interesting behaviors among birds is the egg laying pattern followed by Brown Headed Cowbirds. They will not build a nest but instead will lay their eggs in the nest of other, smaller birds. This occurs while the owner is away. When the momma bird

returns, they will accept the egg as their own, caring for it and hatching it. Then raise the overgrown interloper.

As the Cowbird chicks are raised it can be disastrous for the other chicks because the adopted one will be bigger, pushier. The energy needed to care for it takes away the time and

resources needed from the natural babies. Often the smaller, natural chicks do not survive. It becomes sacrificial love for one who, honestly, doesn't even deserve to be there.

It surprises me that despite all the ruckus and trouble that the momma bird experiences, it will still make a commitment to the cowbird. Loving and raising it as their own. Perhaps they are more like humans than we realize. Parents often pay extra attention to the child that needs it most at that moment. Our compassion and our love compel us to behave in this manner.

From Clarity to Confusion:

Healthy Age-related Brain Changes vs. MCI and Dementia March 5, 2025 10 am to 11:30 am

We will be hosting this conference at our church and inviting the community to learn about brain changes. Many people are helping a spouse or loved one going through these transitions, and most people worry at some point about their own clarity. This conference will help.

Dr. Gallagher will highlight the distinctions between common shifts in cognition as we age, and the onset of Mild Cognitive Impairment (MCI) and dementia. This discourse aims to empower individuals with knowledge to proactively engage in brain health strategies and seek appropriate medical intervention for early signs of cognitive decline that may indicate a progression towards more severe neurocognitive conditions.


Dr. Gallagher directs Hospice of the Valley's Dementia Program, which has received national and international awards for its innovative approaches to dementia care. She is a psychiatric nurse practitioner with a doctoral degree in nursing. Her commitment to improving dementia care was initially inspired by her own experience as a family caregiver, sharing the journey with her loved one from diagnosis to death.

Participants will:

- > Understand dementia and how it progresses from early to advanced stages.
- > Learn to develop strategies to make and maintain meaningful connections with people with dementia.
- Further value the caregiver role and explore ways to reduce stress

Mission Committee News

What can \$1200 do in a West African country? A lot.

As the song goes "Little is much when God is in it". Much praising of God and rejoicing has been done for the \$1200 the Mission Committee sent to Angel, one of our missionaries in a west African county, to fund 2 hand dug wells for those that needed access to physical and spiritual water. One well was dug to provide water for a village of 400 people.

"The village elder, a 105-year-old man, whom nearly everyone in the village of 400 were related to him (including 20 who are Christians), was carried to the newly dug well. As he tasted his first drink of water, he cried. He said that he never thought he would ever drink water from his own well. The people of the village just showered the men who provided the well with blessings, as well as asking to pass on their blessings to the people who gave the money. "

A teacher of another faith had gone to the dedication of a well that had been given by our group and he asked how he could get one - how much did it cost? The men we had sent said that we do this because we are Christians and if we can, we will come back and get a well for you. The money was provided, and a well was dug right in front of the mallam's house. He invited our believers to address the school where he was the teacher to tell them about Christianity. Four of them became believers. Because our guys visited and shared in the area while the well was being dug, twenty-three more people became believers.

Jesus was lifted up and praised as 57 people received Him as their Savior from the digging of these 2 wells that provide accessible water to sustain their physical lives. These people understood that Jesus loves each of them by providing the funds through those at our church who give to missions. The funds along with the timing of the end of rainy season and the availability of the people who knew how to dig the wells, helped the people learn about and accept the God who gives eternal life—The Living Water, Jesus. Don't take your water for granted. Especially, don't take your Savior, the Living Water, and His salvation He extended to you for granted. Rejoice and praise this Jesus, who loves you.

\$1200 for 57 salvations (initially) is a great investment in God's Kingdom! Thank you.
